Global Catholic Education Year in Review 2022

Abstract

Global Catholic Education is a small volunteer-led project to contribute to Catholic education and integral human development. The project and website were launched at the end of November 2020. This report highlights activities implemented under the project in 2022 in four areas: (1) Building knowledge; (2) Serving the community; (3) Promoting dialogue; and (4) Sharing ideas. Annexes provide executive summaries of global reports on Catholic education and on integral human development.


